## MESSAGE FROM THE CHIEF

Dear Mayor Daniels,

The Greeneville Police Department is pleased to present the 2018 Annual Report of its activities and achievements. I take great pride and pleasure in presenting this report, my first as Chief of Police.

During 2018, the department continued to focus on crime prevention, case clearance and traffic management and enforcement. During 2018, GPD cleared 76% of the reported offenses. In addition members of the GPD effected 1572 arrests, an increase of nearly 35% from 2017. The GPD answered 22,450 calls for service in 2018. In 2018, GPD Officers issued 7857 citations, an increase of 5%. GPD's traffic management and enforcement has had a positive impact in the reduction of traffic crashes in 2018 from a total of 832 in 2017 to 751 in 2018, a 9% decrease. Injury crashes were reduced from 174 in 2017 to 162 in 2018. In 2018, GPD reported one traffic fatality.


As reported in the Annual Report of 2017, the Greeneville Police Department was awarded Accreditation through the Tennessee Association of Chiefs of Police (TACP) on May 29, 2018. Members of the GPD have become very active in the TACP. Assistant Chief Mike Crum serves on the Professional Standards Committee and Captain Steve Hixson serves on the False Alarm Committee.

It is my honor to lead this professional group of men and woman that make up the Greeneville Police Department. Their hard work and dedication will surely make our city a safer place to visit and live.

# PATROL

Patrol is the backbone of any police department and the Greeneville Police department is no different. Our Patrol Unit consists of four shifts of eight officers including a Captain, Lieutenant and Sergeant all sharing supervisory responsibilities. Currently the Patrol Sergeant is referred to as a Desk Sergeant and is assigned to the Dispatch office within Greeneville Police Department Headquarters. In the Sergeant's absence with vacation or sick leave, the Captain will assign another certified officer to cover those duties.

Patrol units are the first responders of the department and are the first to arrive on scene to all citizen complaints. They complete the initial investigative report (Incident Report), conduct the appropriate investigation which will lead the officer to make an arrest, refer the incident to CID (Criminal Investigations Division), determine incident to be a Civil Matter or in some cases, a false report. Patrol units also conduct traffic crash investigations in which the officer will investigate the crash scene, complete the TN Uniform Crash Report electronically on their Mobile Phone and decide if the crash is criminal which would lead to a citation or physical arrest. All other time the Patrol Officer is patrolling their assigned zone.

# INVESTIGATIONS

The Criminal Investigations Unit of the Greeneville Police Department is made up of seven members. A Captain, who oversees the unit and is responsible for all investigation within the unit, serves as the Public Information Officer (P.I.O.) for the department, and does all internal affairs investigations. A Lieutenant and Sergeant, who will make command decisions in the absence of the Captain, and four Patrol Detectives.

Work assignments are handed out according to the type of case. All detectives and general investigators hold specialized training in certain areas such as, auto theft, child sex abuse, and elder abuse to name a few. We have three detectives who handle all child sex crimes, one detective who handles all firearms cases, and two detectives who handle elder abuse cases. Major crimes such as rape and homicide are handled as a team. One detective also serves as the General Department Training Officer, which oversees that all officers receive the correct amount of training throughout the year and then reports training to POST (Peace Officers Standards and Training) for approval.



In 2018, the C.I.D. unit was assigned a total of 458 cases and the unit cleared 51.2% of those cases. Of the 458 cases, 88 were closed by arrest. There were 2 Internal Affairs investigations during 2018 for the Police Department. The C.I.D. Unit conducted one employee investigation for other Town Departments.

## **TRAFFIC UNIT**

The Traffic Unit consists of two fulltime officers. In 2018, Patrolman Clifford Lawing retired after 21 years of service with the Greeneville Police Department. Officer Eddie Short joined Officer John Bishop in assignment to the Traffic Unit. Patrolman Bishop is also a Field Training Officer and a portion of his time is dedicated towards training new officers that are hired by the Police Department. The Traffic Unit wrote 1502 citations which is 19 % of all citations in 2018.

## **SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER (SRO)**

The SRO Program consists of six fulltime officers. Officer Brian Moore is assigned to Greeneville High School and Officer Jackie Tweed is assigned to Greeneville Middle School. The other four, Louie Calabrisi, Anthony Thomas, Chris Metcalf and Bucky Craft rotate weekly amongst the four elementary schools. The relationships formed between Law Enforcement and the students have been invaluable and build bonds that will last for years to come.

## **SPECIAL RESPONSE TEAM (SRT)**

The Special Response Team, often referred to as the SWAT team is relied upon to assist in high risk situations. Some of those are Hostage or Barricade situations and high-risk warrant services which is often the result of an undercover operation with the Drug Task Force. In 2018 the SRT responded to 3 calls for service, 10 trainings and assisted with the Citizen's Academy.

## **CRISIS NEGOTIATIONS TEAM**

The Crisis or Hostage Negotiation consists of 3 officers that have received specialized training to become certified in this area. The Crisis Negotiation Team works closely with the SRT Unit, however, was not called upon during this year.

## **EXPLOSIVE ORDINANCE DEVICE (EOD)**

The Greeneville Police Department Bomb Squad has been an integral part of the Greeneville Police Department. The Bomb Squad safely disposes of hazardous devices, inspects suspect packages, and removes old or unsafe explosives that have been discovered by citizens. The Bomb Squad assists in special events such as the Bristol Motor Speedway NASCAR events, Dignitary protection and concerts. The G.P.D. Bomb Squad supports several area Bomb Squads including those located in Kingsport, Johnson City, and Morristown, TN. In addition to local squads, The Bomb Squad supports several Federal agencies. These include: The Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), The Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (BATFE), The U.S. Postal Service, Department of Homeland Security and The U.S. Secret Service.

The G.P.D. Bomb Squad Officers are Accredited Bomb Technicians that receive training at the F.B.I. Hazardous Devices School in Huntsville, Alabama. Each Officer assigned to this unit is required to attend a six-week basic training course. In addition, each Officer on the Bomb Squad attends 40-hour recertification every three years. The Officers also are required to attend a monthly 16-hour training session. These technicians also receive training in post blast

investigation and dignitary protection. The Bomb squad and Special Response team are fully integrated, and technicians are crossed trained to assist SRT team members. The bomb squad responds to all SRT callouts to support the team with robot operations and negotiations.

In 2018 the G.P.D. Bomb Squad responded to 7 Calls for Service and recovered explosive devices on 4 of those incidents. In addition, the unit was on Stand-by for 12 Special Events and conducted 256 hours of training.

## **K-9 UNIT**

The GPD K-9 unit is composed of 4 teams, each consisting of a dog and officer/handler. A fifth K9 team was added in late 2018, as the pending retirement of K9's Rex and Grimm will occur in early 2019. The dogs are invaluable to police work and serve not only as a tool for locating contraband and persons (both missing and offenders), but their presence also serves as a deterrent. The K9 is housed at the handler's residence and becomes part of his family.

In 2018 the GPD K9 unit was responsible for the seizure of 2353.2 grams of marijuana, 454 grams of cocaine, 624.5 grams of meth, 913 grams of heroin and 304 items of drug paraphernalia. The Unit also conducted 17 searches for DTF and the FBI and located an undetermined quantity of heroin, fentanyl and cocaine. The unit conducted 9 public demonstrations, 10 tracks with 4 violator apprehensions.



## **METH TASK FORCE (MTF)**

The MTF is a joint effort combined of Greeneville PD, Greene County SO and Greeneville Fire Department. The MTF responds to any "labs" that are discovered in Greeneville and Greene County. Often time the word "lab" presents itself to be a large lab as we would think of in the hospital or scientific setting. And that can indeed be true, however Meth Labs are most often found to be small and mobile but none the less dangerous.

The Meth Task Force had no responses or incident in 2018.

## **AUXILIARY POLICE UNIT**

Our Auxiliary Unit consists of 18 Officers that work on a part-time basis. Their primary function and assignment is to work weekends along with a fulltime Patrol Officer and special events. Some of those events are parades, the Greene County Fair, and ballgames and school events of Greeneville High and Greeneville Middle Schools, Holiday Celebrations and assisted with several extra duty assignments.

## **RECORDS**

The records division contains two fulltime employees. Phyllis Smith Retired in 2018 after 47 years of service. Tina Jeffers filled the vacancy in records. Tina is responsible for maintaining all citation entries, collections, and state reports. She also oversees Incident/Offence Report validations with the state (TBI).

Tracy Jones works in records and works closely with the Patrol Sergeant in Dispatch. Tracy assists with phone and radio traffic along with maintaining the customer service window. She is responsible for Crash Report Data and is the State's contact for accuracy and efficiency for time sensitive Crash Report Submissions. She is also responsible for conducting background checks, and signs citizens up for classes for the Departments Defensive Driving School. Tracy is Emergency Dispatch and NCIC (National Crime Information Center) certified allowing her full access to state and federal files when assisting dispatch.

Both Tina and Tracy share duties as Court Clerk for the Municipal Court of Greeneville.

## **CHAPLAIN**

Danny Ricker was in the role as the department's Chaplin throughout the year of 2018. Some of Danny's activities were:

- 85 visits to GPO.
- 5 Dispatched calls.
- Attended 13 training opportunities.
- 20 Funerals, Ride-Along, Counseling's or Special Events with GPD

Chaplain Ricker drove 1570 miles and had expenses of \$1,096.74, which is not reimbursed.

In 2018, Pastor David Green joined Ricker in serving as Chaplin for GPD.

## **TECHNOLOGY**

The Greeneville Police Department has partnered with the Greeneville City School System to further advance and improve GPD's use of available technology. This partnership results in the GPD and the Town of Greeneville having the expertise of the GCSS I.T. Staff to address problems that may arise, offer suggestions on new and needed technology and update and maintain the system infrastructure.

During 2018, the Fiber Network was further implemented and much of the infrastructure of GPD's Network was updated to be more streamline and less troublesome. Many technological issues of the past have been corrected and no longer plague GPD. This success would not be possible without the partnership and support of GCSS.

# DRUG ENFORCEMENT

The Greeneville Police Department participates in the 3<sup>rd</sup> Judicial Drug Task force under the authority of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Judicial District Attorney, Dan Armstrong. The Task Force is compiled of officers from Greeneville PD, Greene County SO, Hawkins County SO, and Surgoinsville PD.

The Third Judicial District Drug and Violent Crimes Task Force covers a large area of North Eastern Tennessee. The counties covered are Greene, Hawkins, Hamblen and Hancock which are al mostly rural areas. In the area covered by the task force, we continue to see a large problem with the abuse of pharmaceutical narcotics and the diversion of the same. In the last five years, our area has been inundated with a large amount of crystal methamphetamine a.k.a. ICE. This is becoming a problem in all the counties served by the task force as well as the judicial districts which adjoin our counties.

The Third District Drug and Violent Crime Task Force exist to combat the narcotics trafficking within the Third Judicial District. The task force is needed because narcotic traffickers often cross jurisdictional boundaries to avoid detection. The task force holds jurisdiction in all four counties within the Third Judicial District. The task force also works with other task forces as well as state and federal agencies to combat the ever-changing narcotics trade environment. As in any undertaking such as this, the ability to quickly adjust to the actions of those who seek to damage our communities through the sale and distribution of narcotics and the use of violence.

In 2018, the DTF had 159 cases with approximately 44 arrests and \$135,222.19 of seized assets. A portion of the 159 cases will have the same defendants and/or will still be an ongoing investigation at this time. These numbers do not reflect the work hours utilized in assisting other agencies in various cases and arrests.

## Number Of Calls Report by Hour of Day






