In paragraph two, three, and four discuss three major points or evidences the author used to support his/her main purpose. This should not be a list or bullets. You should explain each fully as the author did for you.

In paragraph five, you need to summarize the main point of the selection again and use appropriate references to the selection to make sure you have completed all of the assignment.

Again, make sure you are correct in all aspects of grammar, word choices, spelling, and content. Do a good job on this assignment for it is a major component of your grade, and you CANNOT make this assignment up when you return to school. PROOFREAD!

On Day Two of closed school, you will read and, perhaps, reread the essay "Martin Luther King Jr.: He Showed Us the Way" by Cesar Chavez on page 1230 in your literature book. In proper theme/essay form, write the following information about the essay:

In paragraph one introduce the essay by giving the title, author, and description of the author's purpose.

In paragraph two, three, and four of the theme discuss three major points or evidences the author used to support his main purpose. This support should not be lists or bullets; you need to discuss them fully.

In paragraph five, summarize the main point again and use appropriate references to the essay to make your theme/essay complete and correct.

Make sure that you have used proper grammar, spelling, word choices, and content. Do a good job on this assignment as well and remember to PROOFREAD!...
