Individuals completing this form will be protected from retaliation. To the extent possible, individuals investigating this incident will protect the confidentiality of the parties reporting the incident.

It is not necessary to exhaust any administrative complaint process before pursuing civil law remedies.

California law prohibits discrimination, harassment, intimidation, and bullying based on a student's actual or perceived disability, gender, gender identity, gender expression, nationality, race or ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation, or association with a person or group with one or more of these actual or perceived characteristics.
