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Student growth is a measure of how much students are learning each year. Each student receives a Student Growth Percentile (SGP) for English Language Arts/Literacy (ELA) in grades 4 through 8 and for Mathematics in grades 4 through 7 that explains their progress compared to students who had the same test scores in previous years.

A student’s SGP falls between 1 and 99 and can be grouped into three levels: **Low Growth: Less than 35** **Typical Growth: Between 35 and 65** **High Growth: Greater than 65**

If the student growth percentiles for all students in the school are ordered from smallest to largest, the median student growth percentile (mSGP) for the school is the percentile in the middle of that list. 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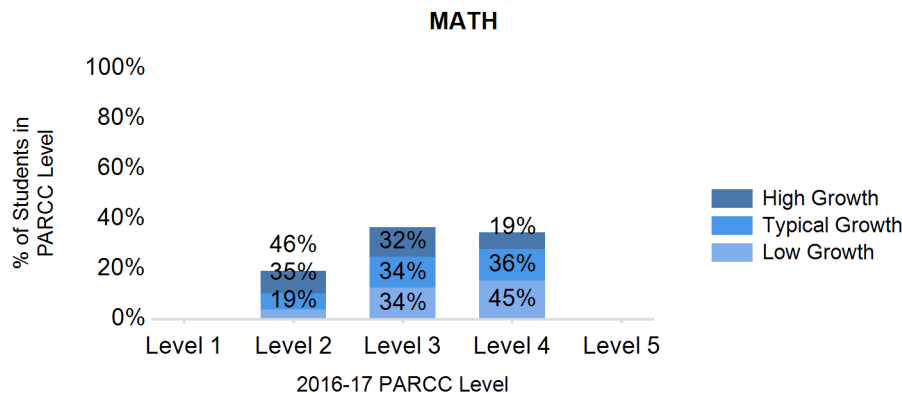
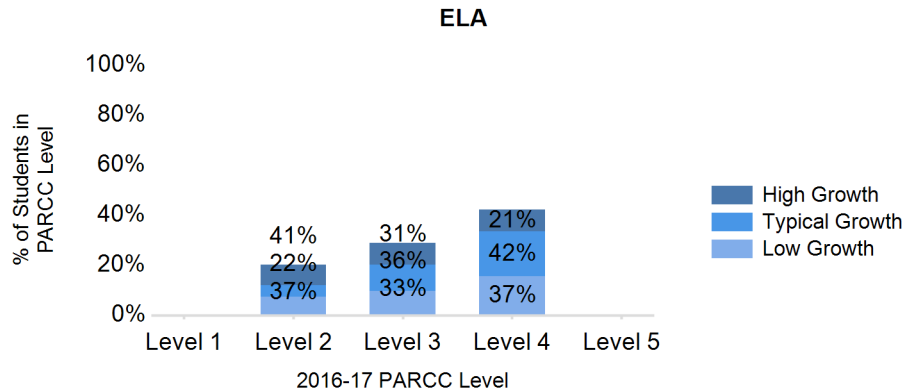
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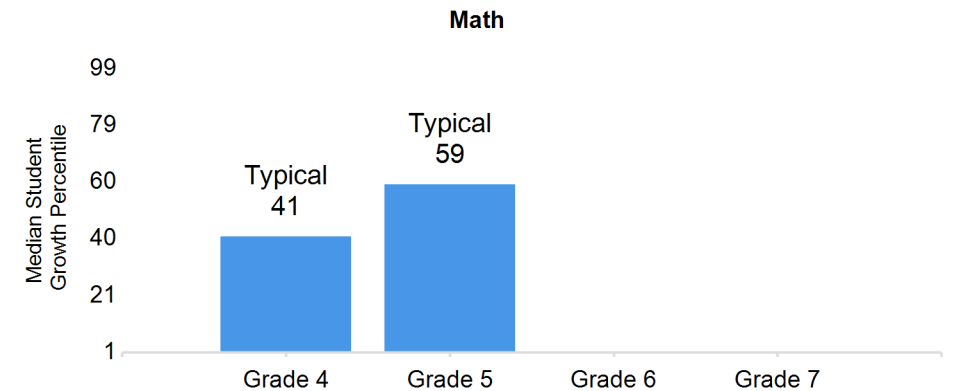
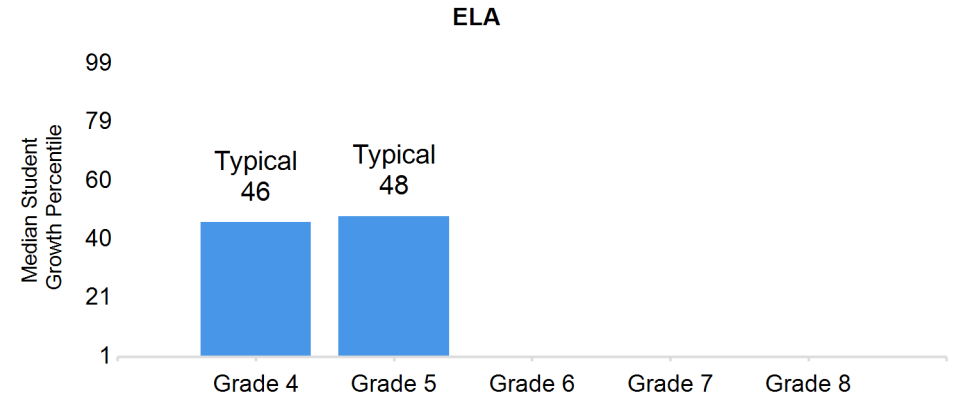
Student Growth by Performance Level

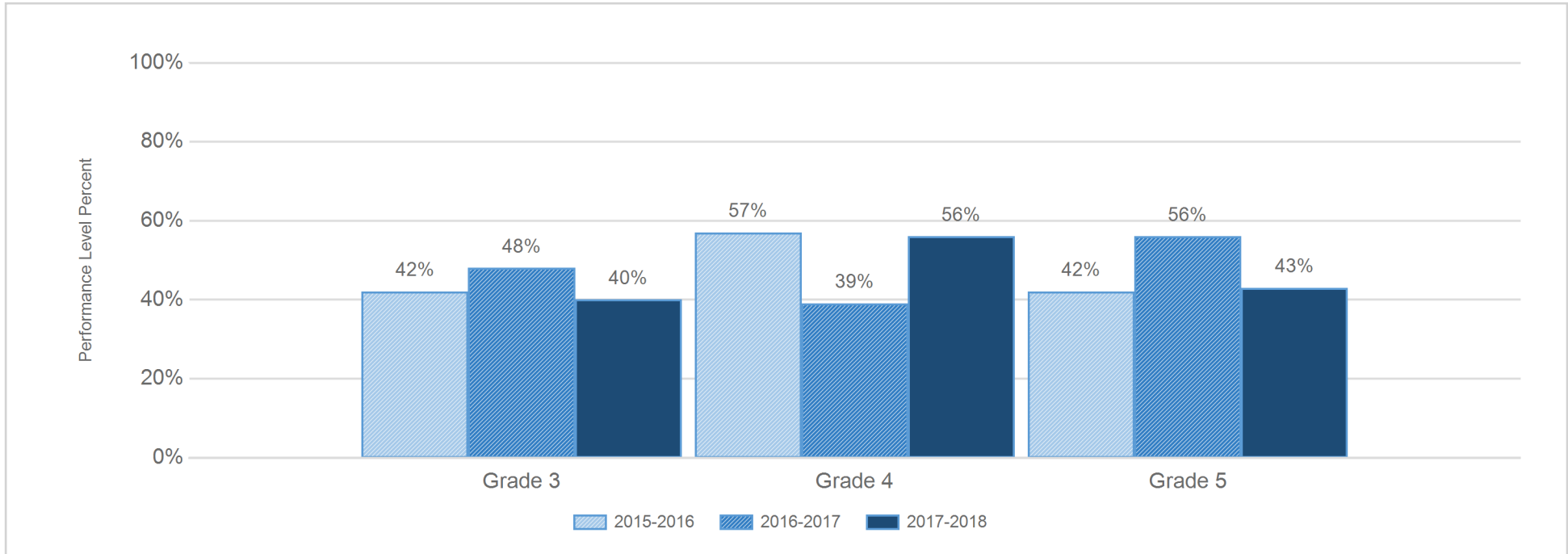


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English Language Arts/Literacy Assessment - Performance Trends

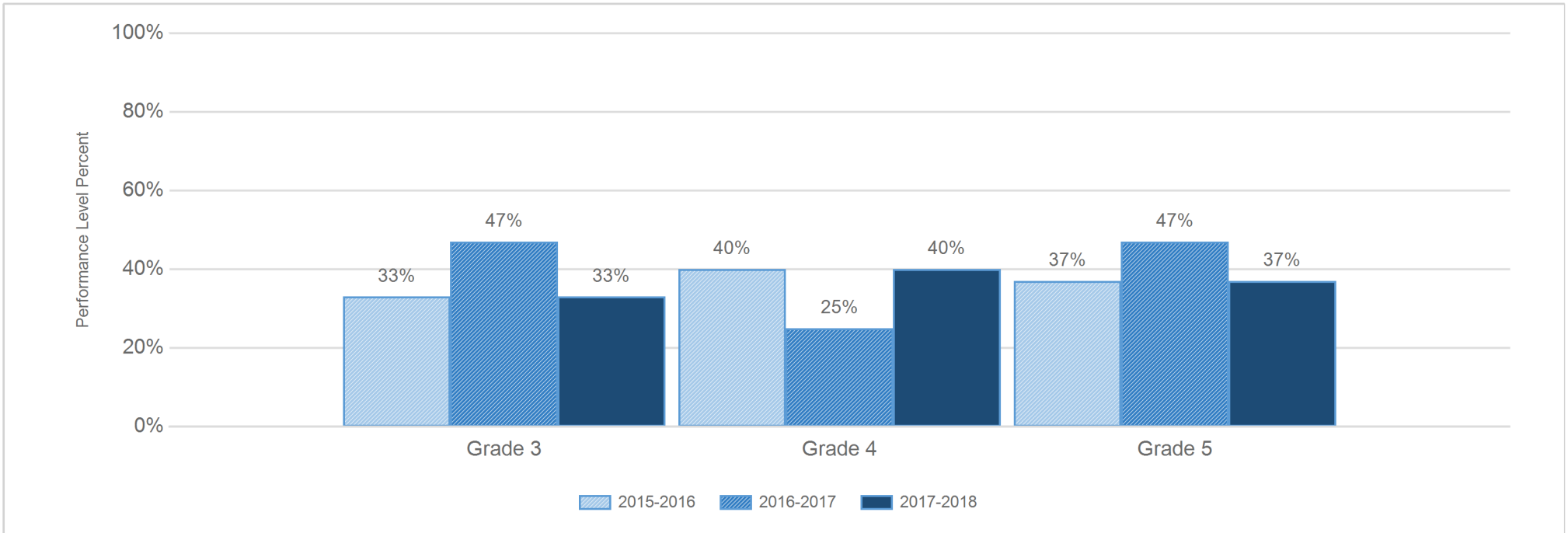

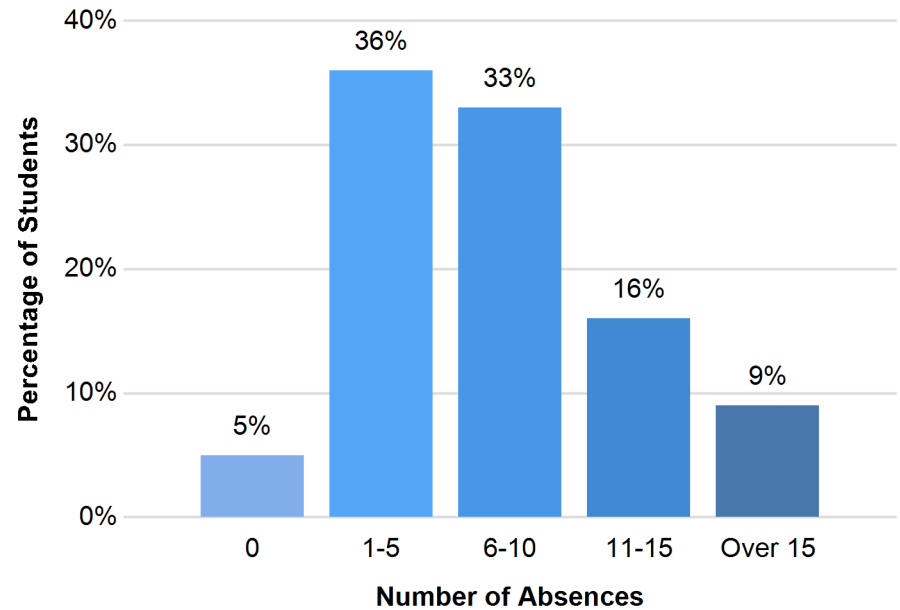

This graph shows the percentage of K-12 students by the number of days they were absent during the school year.





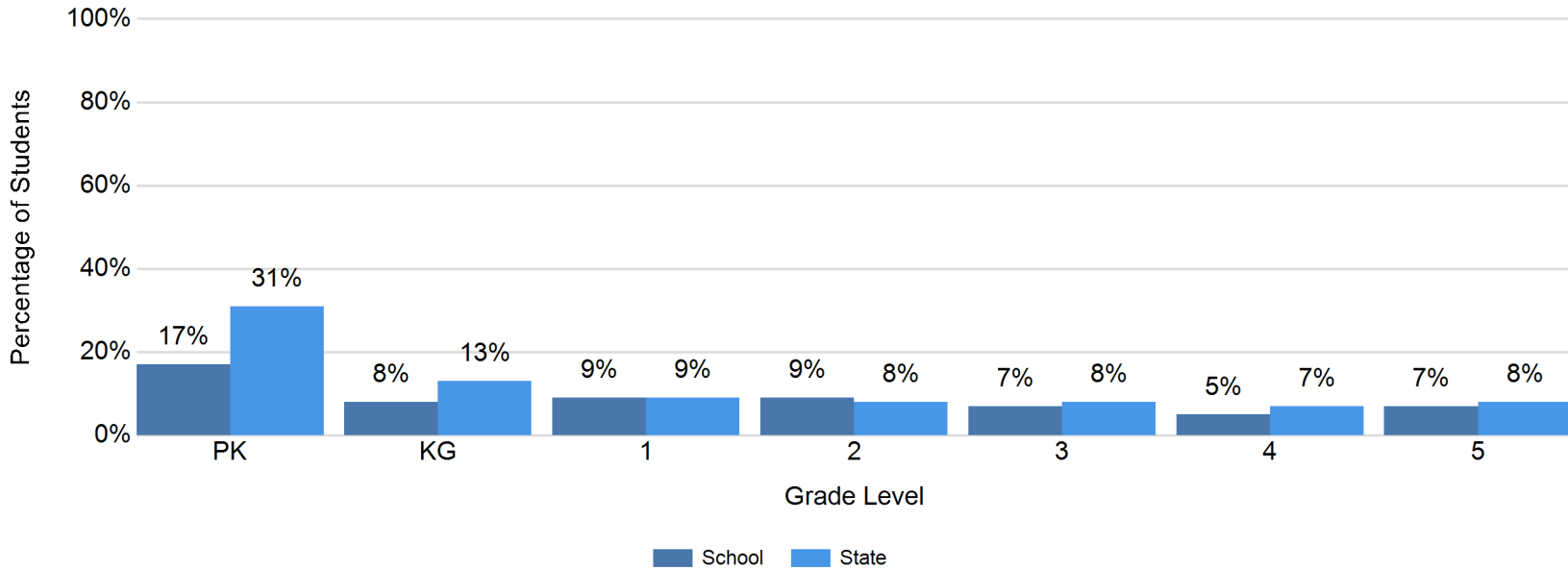
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Chronic Absenteeism by Grade

Intense professional development combined with a comprehensive curriculum that helps young children to develop cognitive, social-emotional, self-regulation, and foundational academic skills. Within the program teachers incorporate the use of technology using iPads to present Power Tools to students which aids in teaching reading strategies. Teachers report on student progress on a trimester basis utilizing the Teaching Strategies Gold Assessment which is an observation based assessment that includes all areas of development and content based learning in literacy and mathematics.</p>

Students in all grades attend school from 8:30am-2:55pm. Students participate in academic subjects as well as related arts on a daily basis. Students are required to wear uniforms to school. Communication with parents is on-going through the Realtime Parent portal, the district website, the Remind app, and Class Dojo.
