Keep the Magic Alive (Kinda-Sorta Wisdom from a Kinda-Sorta Crazy Teacher)

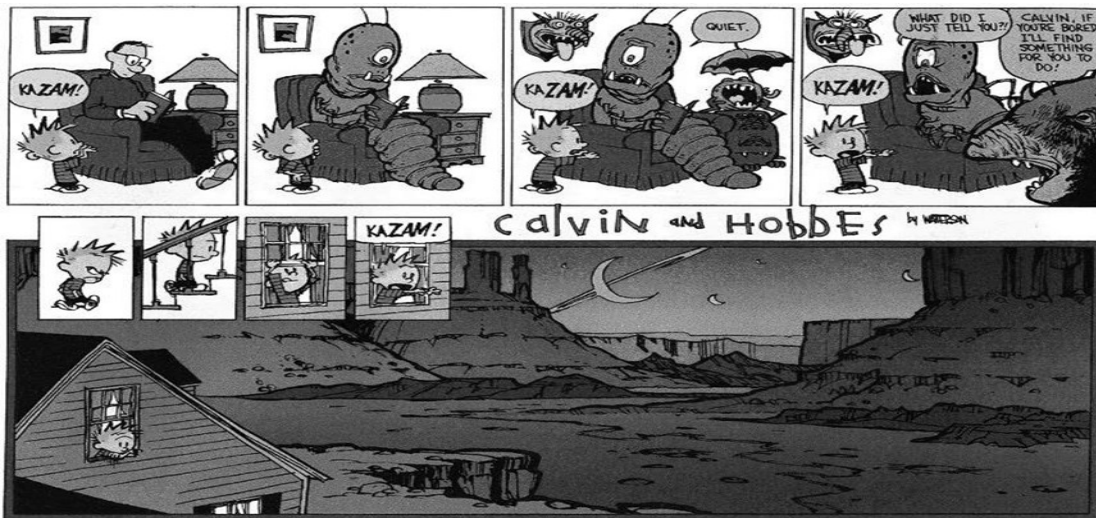
